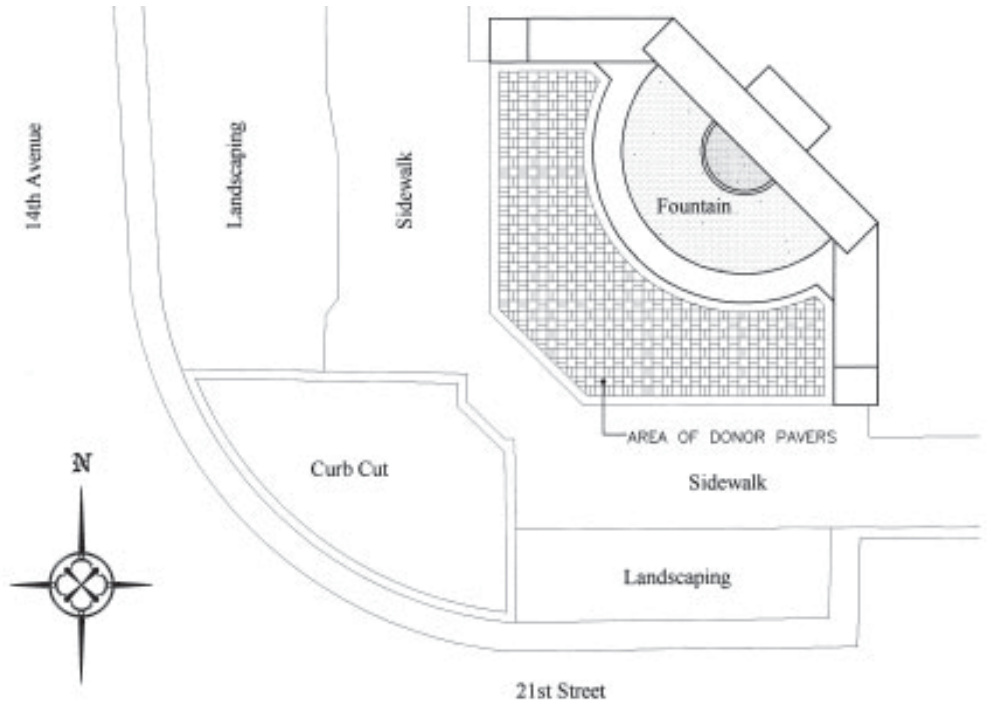
Rotary's Dream

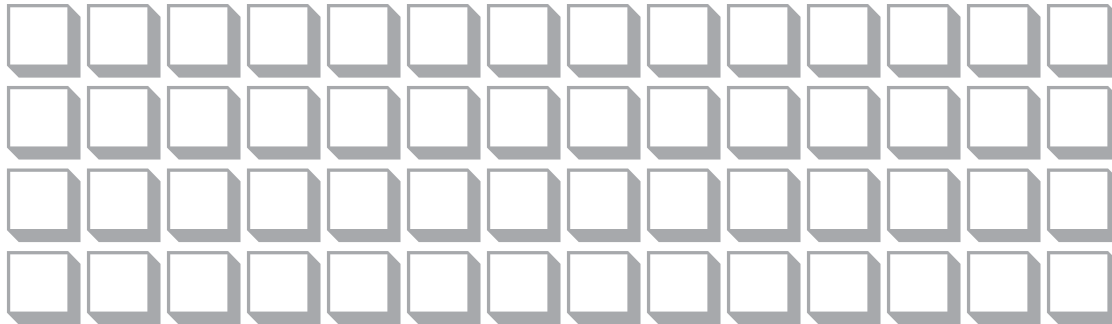
